Membership and Accession





Since the establishment of GGGI as an inter-governmental organization in 2012, its membership has grown to 48 Members as of Nov 5, 2023. A further 23 countries and regional integration organizations have formally expressed interest to join and commenced their accession to the Establishment Agreement.

1. Membership

Membership to the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI) is open to any UN member state or regional integration organization that subscribes to the objectives of GGGI, namely, promoting sustainable development of developing and emerging countries, including the least developed countries, by:

- Supporting and diffusing a new paradigm of economic growth: green growth, which is a balanced advance of economic growth and environmental sustainability;
- Targeting key aspects of economic performance and resilience, poverty reduction, job creation, social inclusion, and environmental sustainability; and
- Creating and improving the economic, environmental and social conditions of countries through partnerships between developed and developing countries and the public and private sectors.

Members of GGGI benefit from:

- Technical assistance delivered through a mix of global, regional and country-specific programming, guided, funded through voluntary core and program/project earmarked contributions from partners; and
- Access to knowledge sharing and good practice. All Member States have access to the knowledge to scale up
 green growth solutions and can be involved in knowledge exchange to identify good practices and approaches
 that may be applied in different country contexts.

2. Process of Accession

Membership to GGGI requires a Member State of the United Nations or a regional integration organization to complete the formalities required for the GGGI Establishment Agreement to have the force of law of a treaty. The Member State of the United Nations or regional integration organization will become a Member State of GGGI on the thirtieth day after the deposit of its **Instrument of Accession** to the Director-General of GGGI.

Recognizing that ratification, acceptance or approval of the GGGI Establishment Agreement takes time, Member States of the United Nations or regional integration organizations are encouraged to submit a **Letter of Intent** to become a Member State of GGGI to the Director-General.

Initial discussion between Government and GGGI regarding interest in Membership Head of State, Head of Govt, or Foreign Minister submits letter of intent to GGGI Director-General Govt ratifies, accepts, or approves the Establishment Agreement in accordance with its domestic process

Head of State, Head of Govt or Foreign Minister deposits Instrument of Accession to GGGI Director-General Country becomes a GGGI Member State on 30th day following DG's receipt of the original Instrument of Accession In parallel with accession, GGGI seeks privileges and immunities for the proper functioning in Member countries, as provided for under the Establishment Agreement. The **Agreement on Privileges and Immunities** provides a framework to facilitate GGGI's presence, operations and activities in the country. The agreements confer on GGGI, and its personnel privileges, immunities and exemptions customarily afforded to international organizations to enable it to function efficiently in the country as an international organization.

3. Obligations of Membership

- All Member States of GGGI serve on the Assembly, the supreme organ of GGGI that meets once a year.
 Member States may stand for election and serve on the Council.
- Membership does not require any obligatory financial contributions. However, Member States are encouraged to support GGGI and ensure its financial stability through voluntary contributions, in-kind contributions, active engagement in activities, and/or other appropriate means.
